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1. Qualifications

The Senior Ladies' Regional Tournament shall be open to female golfers who have achieved the age of 50 on or before the first day of the Tournament; who are members of a recognised golf club; who have Amateur Status in accordance with the current Amateur Status Rules of the R&A Rules Limited; and who hold an CONGU Exact Handicap or overseas equivalent of not more than 20.4 at date of entry.

2. Regulations

- a) Entries shall be limited to 100 on a first come first serve basis. The next 30 entries received in excess of 100 will be placed on a waiting list and the Tournament will be deemed closed. Unsuccessful entrants will have their entries returned.
- b) Competitors may enter on-line on the ELGA website, download an entry form or contact the ELGA Office for a form to be sent by post (www.englishladiesgolf.org). Entries must reach the English Ladies' Golf Association, Edgbaston Golf Club, Church Road, Birmingham B15 3TB by noon on the date on which the entries close. No entry will be included in the draw unless complete in every detail.
- c) On-line entries must be accompanied by debit/credit card payment. Entries by post must accompany a cheque. Cheques should be made payable to ELGA. No entry will be included in the draw unless complete in every detail. Entry Fees will not be refunded after the closing date. Entries by fax, using the official entry form, will be accepted subject to payment of the Entry Fee within 7 days and prior to the closing date. Entries by telephone are not accepted.
- d) All entries shall be subject to the approval of the Tournament Committee of the Association, which shall have the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason for its decision, which shall be final.
- e) The draw for partners will be done after the closing date (Noon, Friday 16 June).
- f) Competitors must register IN PERSON at the ELGA Tournament Office at the Golf Club no later than 3 p.m. on the day prior to the commencement of the Tournament. Penalty for breach - DISQUALIFICATION. Telephone calls MAY be accepted in EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES. Please note - "Exceptional Circumstances" relate to breakdowns, or situations beyond your control that prevent you from fulfilling your intention to register in person.
- g) A current CONGU Handicap Certificate or overseas equivalent should be produced when signing in. Failure to produce proof of handicap by the time you return your scorecard after the first round will result in Disqualification. A competitor so disqualified may act as a marker.
- h) The Committee reserves the right to arrange and/or alter starting times.
- i) In all matters, the decision of the Tournament Committee is final.
- j) In the event of adverse conditions, the Committee reserves the right to alter the format of the competition in order to achieve a result.

3. Conditions

- a) The Tournament shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the R&A Rules Limited and with Local Rules as may be approved by the Tournament Committee.
- b) The Tournament shall consist of 36 Holes Strokeplay. 18 holes on the first day and 18 holes on the second day for which two draws will be made.
- c) In the event of a tie the result shall be decided over the last 18 holes, the last 9, 6, 3 or 1 hole and if there is a further tie, over the same holes of the first round.
- d) The ball the player uses must be named on the current List of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the R&A Rules Limited. Penalty for a breach is Disqualification.
- e) Driving Clubs : The model and loft of any driver that the player carries must be listed on the current Conforming Driver Head List issued by R&A Rules Limited. Penalty for Breach of Condition - Disqualification.
- f) Competitors may not engage a professional or assistant professional as a Caddy.
- g) Players shall walk at all times during a stipulated round unless prior permission has been sought from the Tournament Committee. Penalty for breach of condition; TWO STROKES FOR EACH HOLE at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round: FOUR STROKES. Use of any unauthorised vehicle shall be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach occurred. Otherwise the player shall be Disqualified.
- h) If the player arrives at her starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after her starting time in the absence of circumstances, which warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is TWO STROKES. Penalty for lateness beyond five minutes is Disqualification.
- i) A Competitor shall not knowingly make use of any drug to enhance her performance. Any Competitor infringing this condition or, if asked to do so refusing to take a test, may be Disqualified.
- j) Each player is responsible for playing without undue delay. The pace of play procedure, detailing the Time Allowance, Procedure when groups are out of position and the penalties for breach of condition, is clearly displayed on the Competitors notice board at the Tournament.
- k) Motorised buggies may be utilised by Competitors who have sought permission from the Tournament Committee before the Tournament, on presentation of a current medical certificate of disability and then only if the host club permits the use of such buggies. The buggy may only be used by the person named on the certificate and may only carry the player, her Caddy and equipment.
- l) Please note that, under the Rules of Amateur Status, a player's name should only appear on a bag tag or in small print on the golf bag itself. A player may be deemed to be advertising the manufacturer of that golf bag if her own name appears in large letters, which would constitute a breach of Amateur Status Rule 6-2 (Lending Name or Likeness).
